ASK THESE QUESTIONS WITH YOUR KIDS

Q: Why did God deliver His people from slavery?

Exodus 7:16

A: So they could worship the Lord in the wilderness.

Q: How did God appear on the mountain? Exodus 19:16, 18

A: A dense cloud, thunder and lightning came down from the mountain. Smoke covered Mt. Sinai as the Lord came down in the form of fire. The mountain shook violently.

Q: Why did God give His people the Ten Commandments, and what are some of them?

Exodus 20

A: The commandments are God's laws and instructions. They tell God's people how to live and what it means to be His people.

Do not make any idols.

Do not misuse the Lord's name

Honor your father and mother

Do not lie

Q: What is the first commandment? Exodus 20:3

A: You must not have any other god but me

Q: How can we love God? How can we love others?

Did you know?

Share these facts to get the conversation started.

- God initiated relationship with the future Israelites through the covenant He made with Abram (later Abraham).
- In Exodus 19—24, God gave His people the Ten Commandments as part of the Mosaic covenant. This marked the beginning of a new era in the history of God's people.
- The Mosaic covenant demanded not only that the Israelites conform to a set of laws but also that their hearts be oriented toward God.
- The Mosaic covenant also gave a foretaste of what was to come—the new covenant that would not be written on tablets of stone but on the hearts and in the minds of all those who believe (Hebrews 8:10).

BLESSING

Blessings are often used in the Bible. A blessing can be a prayer of commission, a portion of Scripture, or words to encourage and guide.
