## God's Presence Inspires Worship

King David 1 Samuel 16-17; 2 Samuel 6

## Did you know?

Share these facts to get the conversation started.

- The book of 2 Samuel records King David's worship after retrieving the ark of the covenant.
- King David and his men reclaimed the ark from Kiriath Jearim, a city located about nine miles from Jerusalem.
- Before this, the ark was in Beth Shemesh, where the Philistines left it seven months after capturing it in battle.
- While they held the ark, the Philistines experienced many terrible things, including tumors, boils, and an infestation of rats. The Philistines didn't understand God's power, so they gladly returned the ark to the Israelites.
