EPIKOS MAYFAIR ROAD

In 1954, two churches, that had roots going as far back as the 1870s, merged to become one church. Peace Memorial Church and St. Paul's Church formed Calvary Memorial Evangelical & Reformed Church in the Northwest corner of Wauwatosa. Three years later the church voted to become Calvary Memorial United Church of Christ. For 65 years, this church faithfully served the northern part of Wauwatosa and the surrounding communities.


In December of 2019, Epikos Church purchased the building to continue the gospel work God is already doing in the Wauwatosa community and beyond. The campus sits along the Menomonee River just south of Hampton Avenue on Mayfair Road. Through the great legacy of the past six decades coupled with the desire to see continued gospel multiplication, Epikos Mayfair Road will be a church on mission to reach others inside and outside of its rich, historical walls.

Epikos Mayfair Road is a church surrounded by many different communities, cultures, and economic backgrounds. The common thread that will unify the people of this campus will be our foundation in Christ and our hope in the gospel.

As common throughout the history of the expanding city with the growth of industry and commerce, families were drawn to the call for the needed workforce. The influx of families helped establish



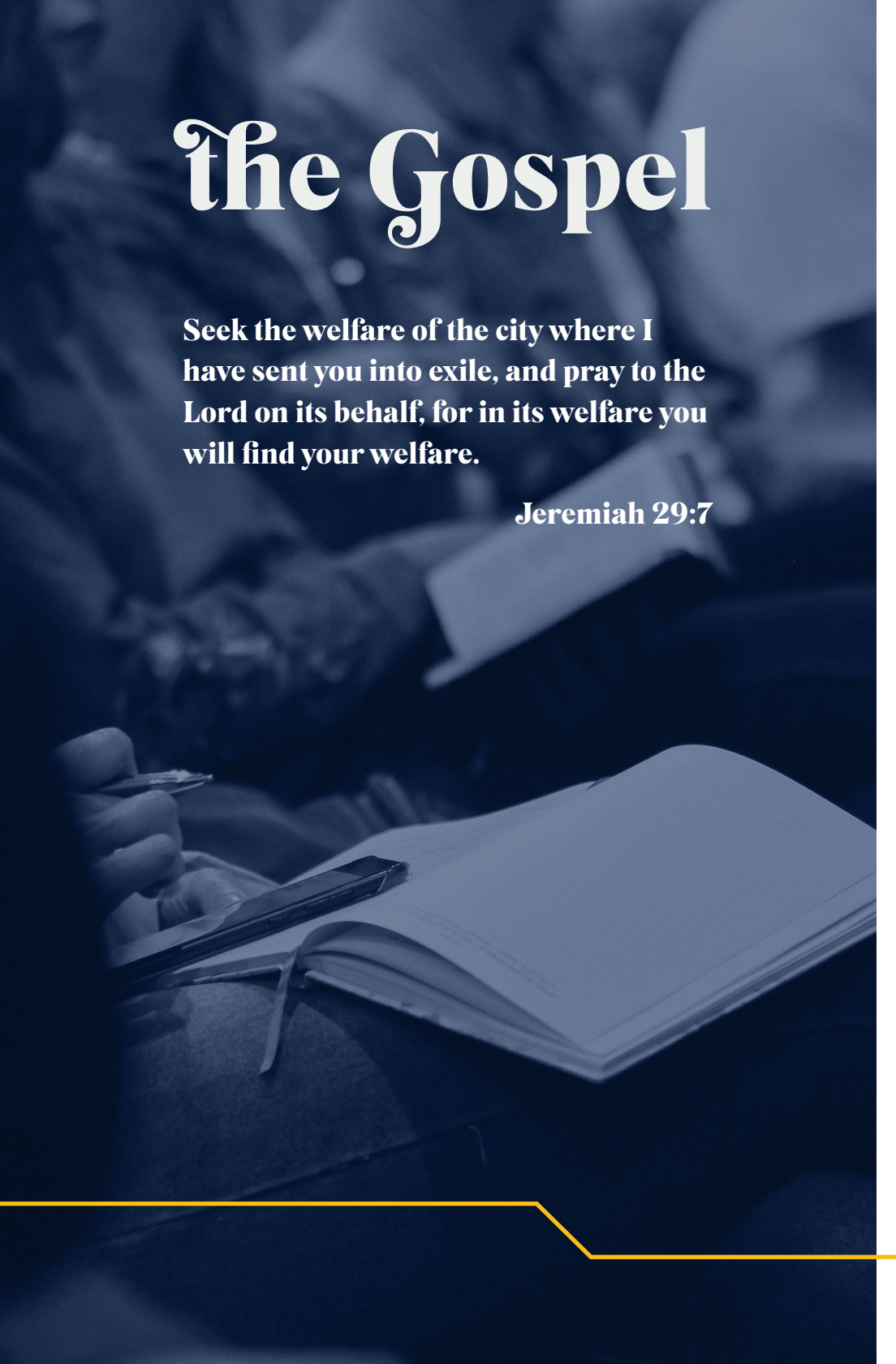

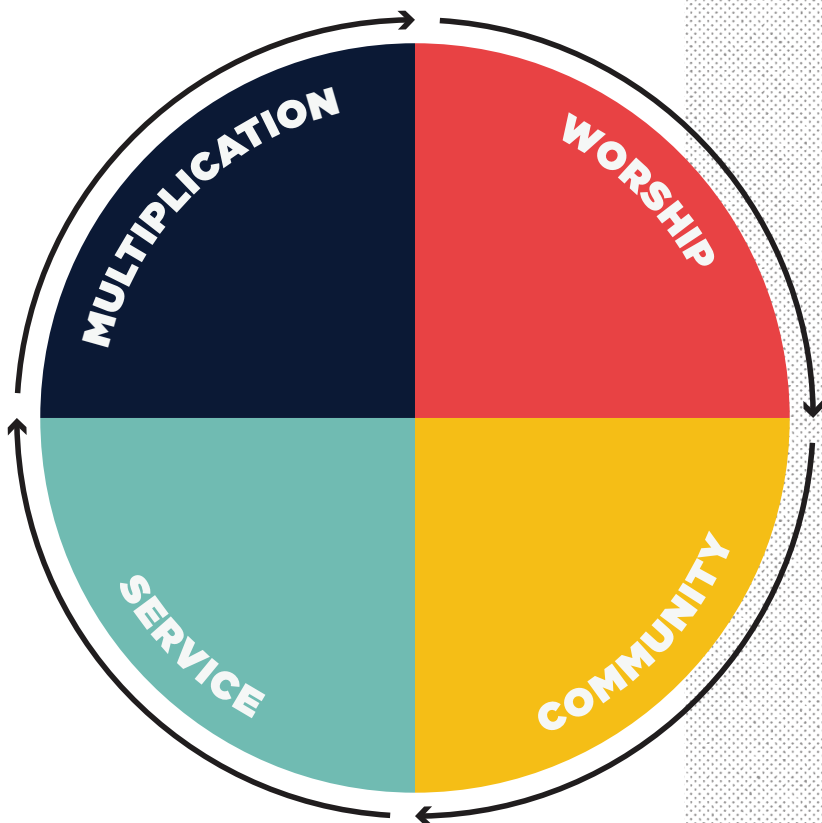

MEET CAMPUS PASTOR FRANK GIL

My name is Frank. I am a first generation American that was born to immigrants in Tampa, Florida. I grew up nominally Catholic, very Cuban, and with a love for laughter, and having a good time. Although I grew up religious and attended church, my life changed when I was 17 years old on a mission trip to the Bahamas. I had signed up simply because it sounded fun and it was a good way to help others. At that time, I did not realize the impact it would have on my life.

While in the Bahamas, I met a woman dying of AIDS but living her life for Jesus. Her joy and passion for the Lord was seen by everyone who surrounded her. As a high schooler, I questioned how a person who knew she was going to die of disease could

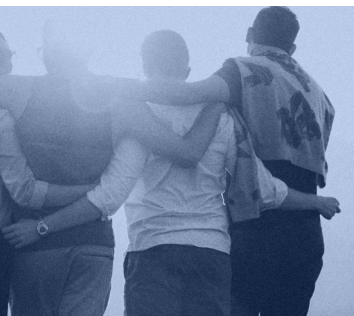


have so much joy and not resent the God she was worshiping. That hot summer afternoon she answered that question by sharing with me the true meaning of Philippians 4:13. Although her life may not have gone how she had wished, her joy and strength was in Jesus and not in her circumstances. That sealed it for me. I wanted that kind of joy! From that day on, I put my faith and hope in Jesus alone for my life and through His strength, I can continue to find joy in His salvation.

Shortly after that trip to the Bahamas, I was asked to make a decision about what I wanted to do after high school. I choose to play college football, but my heart knew I wanted to go into ministry. The Lord felt the same way and altered my life plans. After I began my college football career, it abruptly ended with a season-ending knee injury. That injury led me to make a difficult, but ultimately a more fulfilling decision, to leave my college scholarship to attend a small Bible college in central Florida. This is where I fell in love with studying and preaching God's word and sharing the good news of the Gospel with those that would listen to me.

Around that same time, I met my wife, Cori, at a Christian punk rock concert. I messaged her on MySpace after the show and the rest is history. Cori and I have been married for over 11 years. We don't have any kids, but we have a super great and affectionate dog named Grace. Cori and I are those odd adults who are really into Disney and go to the parks without any kids. She is very vegan and I am very not.

I joined Epikos in September of 2015. For the past four years, I have been blessed to serve the teenagers and their families as the Student Ministry Pastor of FUSE. Beyond that, I have had the privilege of speaking into student ministry on a national level through speaking at conferences, writing, coaching, and podcasting. For over 13 years, I have been doing ministry to students and their families and it has been an absolute blessing, but I am so very thrilled about this new journey God has for me in becoming the campus pastor of Epikos Mayfair Road. I am excited about bringing all those years of creative ministry to teenagers and their families to the next campus of Epikos. It is going to be a great time and I look forward to seeing you there!
